SHOW RULES

1. Show will be sanctioned by The International Boer Goat Association and their rules shall govern. The judge for the show will come from the association approved judges list
IBGA Sanction Rules: Eligibility of Animals
Only goats registered in a recognized association (International Boer Goat Assn., American Boer Goat Assn., Canadian Boer Goat Assn. and the USBGA) must be shown in official International Boer Goat Assn. Sanctioned Shows.
2. Classes will be provided for both Percentage and Full Blood Boer Goats.
3. Base date for the show is **November 12, 2011**.
4. **The deadline for registration forms and entry fees is October 1, 2011. Late registration will be accepted until October 15, 2011 with doubled entry fees. No entries will be accepted after October 15, 2011. Any entries received after this date will be returned. NO EXCEPTIONS! Entry fees must accompany the entry form. Make checks payable to: National Peanut Festival (NPF). Mail entries to: National Peanut Festival, 5622 US Hwy 231 South, Dothan, AL 36301.**
5. Entry fee is **\$10 per animal, plus a \$5 Pen Fee (including Tack Pens)**, payable to NPF.
6. The animal Birth Date and Registry Number must be included on the entry form.
7. Alabama Health rules shall be observed. **ALL goats must have an official health certificate** issued by an accredited veterinarian, certifying the animals to be free from symptoms of contagious and/or infectious diseases. Certificate must be issued within 30 days of the show.
8. The barn will be open for goats to arrive at 12:00 Noon on Friday, November 11, 2011.
9. Check-in will be from 12:00 Noon until 10:00 PM on Friday, November 11, 2011. A last minute check-in will be held on Saturday morning at 8:00 AM. Show books will close at 8:00 AM.
10. Exhibitor quarters must be kept clean.
11. All pens will be set and have first shavings. **NO PENS ARE TO BE REARRANGED!**
12. Animals will be released after completion of the Boer Goat Show.
13. No pens are to be rearranged. The only exception is the center gates may be opened.
14. **ALL TRAILERS NEED TO BE MOVED TO THE DESIGNATED AREA AFTER UNLOADING. THOSE LEFT UNATTENDED WILL BE TOWED.**
