GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

SPECIAL NOTE: ONCE ANIMALS ARE UNLOADED, ALL TRAILERS MUST BE MOVED IMMEDIATELY TO THE DESIGNATED AREA. THOSE LEFT UNATTENDED WILL BE TOWED.

1. Each exhibitor must be a member of a 4-H, FFA or FCCLA club and owner of exhibit.
2. Each exhibitor will show animals at own risk and must furnish own feed and care.
3. Health requirements are the same as the Open Hog Show.
4. Registration papers must be presented at the time of entry.
5. Exhibitor may enter only 2 animals per class.
6. Only animals placing in Junior Show will be allowed to enter the Open Show.
7. Entries are on a first come, first serve basis. State number of pens needed on entry form.
8. Prize money will be mailed from the National Peanut Festival office. Please put a complete mailing address on your entry form. All winners are required to supply their Social Security Number to the NPF office in order to process premium checks. No premium money will be issued to winners without this information.
9. No dogs are allowed in the barns.
10. Entry fee is \$3.00 per animal, per show. **The deadline for registration forms and entry fees is October 1, 2011. Late registration will be accepted until October 15, 2011 with doubled entry fees. No entries will be accepted after October 15, 2011. Any entries received after this date will be returned. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
11. Pens must be cleaned before leaving fairgrounds.
12. Gilts may be shown in Market Hog Show. (See rules for Market Hog Show).

PREMIUMS

The following premiums will be paid for comparative classes in each of the breeds having 40 or more animals. 20 to 39 animals will pay 5 premiums per class. Breeds with less than 20 entries compete in a Mixed Breed Show.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

SPECIAL NOTE: ONCE ANIMALS ARE UNLOADED, ALL TRAILERS MUST BE MOVED IMMEDIATELY TO THE DESIGNATED AREA. THOSE LEFT UNATTENDED WILL BE TOWED.

1. Entries are open to all breeders of purebred swine. Any breed will have at least 15 animals to show as a breed. Breeds with less than 15 entries will be grouped and shown as Mixed Breed.
2. Entries will be taken on a first come, first serve basis. State number of pens needed on your entry form.
3. All entries must be in place by 12:00 Noon, Wednesday, November 9, 2011. All hogs will be required to remain at the show until 4:00 PM, Thursday, November 10, 2011.
4. Prize money will be mailed from the National Peanut Festival office. Please be sure to put a complete mailing address on your entry form.
5. Registration certificate will be required for each animal entered.
6. Each exhibitor will show animals at own risk and must furnish own feed and care.
7. All swine exhibited must be accompanied by an official health certificate indicating that they are free from all contagious and infectious diseases. The certificate must be signed by an accredited veterinarian.
All breeding animals must have tested negative in all dilutions to Brucellosis or originate from a validated herd. This information must be recorded on the official health certificate and, in the case of having originated from a validated herd, the certificate number and the expiration date must be recorded.
All swine exhibited must have tested negative for Pseudo-rabies within 30 days of the show and must originate from a herd that had no signs of Pseudo-rabies within the previous 12 months or a qualified free herd.
8. Any exhibitor in any way involved in showing a fraudulent entry will automatically forfeit all prize money won by himself or his farm and will be barred from future participation in this show.
9. Each exhibitor can be paid a maximum of only two prizes per class.
10. Breeds with the most entries will be shown first and in descending order.

GRAND CHAMPION ... 1st Place January, February, March & April pigs are eligible to show.

RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION ... animals eligible for Grand Champion & animals standing second to Grand Champion in class are eligible to show.

- No dogs are allowed in the barns.
- Entry fee is \$3.00 per animal, per show. **The deadline for registration forms and entry fees is October 1, 2011. Late registration will be accepted until October 15, 2011 with doubled entry fees. No entries will be accepted after October 15, 2011. Any entry received after this date will be returned. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- Pens must be cleaned before leaving fairgrounds.
- If you have any complaints, please submit them verbally within four (4) days and in writing within ten (10) days to the National Peanut Festival office.**
